


If you want the town to collect appliances, you must pay an **Appliance Pick-up Fee of \$20.00** at Town Hall prior to collection day. Residents may take appliances to a local salvage yard to avoid the fee. Residents may also take tires and appliances to the **Guilford County Scrap Tire and White Goods Collection Facility** 2138 Bishop Road (located just south of the Wet 'n Wild Water Park, between Holden Rd. and Groometown Rd.)



Residents of Guilford Co. may take their old computers, televisions, paint, auto fluids and old cell phones to the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Center in Greensboro located at 2750 Patterson St. Wednesday - Friday 10:00 am to 6:00 pm, Saturdays 8:00 am to 2:00 pm.

Why recycle?

It saves valuable landfill space.

State law requires yard waste to be separated from trash and recycling

Loose leaves are collected from late October to mid February:

- Place leaves behind curb by 7 am
- Remove all sticks, rocks & debris
- Do not park on, in front of or near leaves

Christmas trees are collected on the yard waste collection days:

- Place tree at the curb by 7 am
- Remove all lights, wire, tinsel, ornaments and tree stands
- Trees that are over five feet tall should be cut in half or into smaller, manageable segments

Recycle the Right Way



The Jamestown Curbside Recycling Program is available to Jamestown citizens and businesses with solid waste service. Recyclable materials in clear plastic bags will be picked up on Mondays. Residents should place material at the curb by 7 a.m., and businesses by 9 a.m.

Materials should be placed in clear plastic bags, and no sorting is required. Large pieces of cardboard and plastic may be left adjacent to the clear bags. Material should be clean, dry, and it is best to leave lids off of containers. All of the material will go into the same truck and will be separated at the recycling facility.

The recycler will not pick up bags with non-recyclable materials nor bags that have been contaminated with food, dirt, and oil. Contaminated bags will be picked up on Tuesdays with the garbage collection.

Materials that are banned from landfills such as paint, electronics, oil, etc. must be taken to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center in Greensboro.
